In our literacy lessons this term, we will start by looking at persuasive writing. Then, using Stitch Head by Guy Bass as our key text, we will work on our narrative writing and explore alternative endings to the text. Finally, we will end the term by exploring recount writing. Throughout the term, we will also continue to work on all the Year Four spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) as well as handwriting.

Maths

In our maths lessons this term we will begin by focusing on fractions. We will then move on to decimals and finally finish the term exploring money. We will also be continuing to learn and retain rapid recall of our times tables facts up to 12 x 12.

Spellings

This term we will be revisiting the year 4 word list, which are the statutory spellings. The children's spellings will be given to them on a Monday for them to stick into their jotters. The full list of words are also set on spelling shed for the term.
